## Chemical spillage at school pool

An assistant caretaker at a Redbridge school was taken to hospital with breathing difficulties on Monday fol-lowing a chemical spill.

Firefighters were called to a spillage in the swimming pool area of Newbridge School, Gresham Drive, Chadwell Heath.
Staff and 60 children were

told to keep away from the pool and its neighbouring plant area after sodium bisulfite and sodium hypochlorite were spilled.

The caretaker was taken to Queen's Hospital, Rom-ford, with minor breathing difficulties but informed Redbridge Council on Monday that he was fine.
